Allegheny County Executive Rich Fitzgerald Perspectives from the Front Lines

Interview Summary

Rich Fitzgerald, the County Executive of Allegheny County, discusses the challenges that counties have faced in responding to the COVID-19 crisis. The interview also touches on the importance of the expertise of public health officials in planning and the need for collaboration between counties, the state, and local governments. The County Executive provides insight into measures that Allegheny County has taken to ease the burdens of voting in the upcoming primary election and managing the county's criminal justice system during the pandemic.

Suggested Classroom Discussion Questions

- □ Allegheny County Executive Rich Fitzgerald discussed the importance of government leaders' inperson presence to identify and solve challenges in partnership with community members. According to the interview, how do leaders instill faith in and understand the needs of their constituents while socially distancing?
- ☐ According to County Executive Fitzgerald, how have politics complicated or challenged COVID-19 response efforts?
- ☐ What disparities have become more apparent, and in many cases exacerbated, as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic?
- □ To curb the spread of COVID-19, Allegheny County postponed its primary elections and expanded vote-by-mail services. What are the benefits and detriments of vote-by-mail services? Do you think vote-by-mail opportunities will increase voter turnout in the November presidential election? Why or why not?
